- Find a sunny spot. Edible plants will need 8 to 10 hours of direct sunlight.
- When building your raised bed, make sure that you build it big enough for what you plan to grow.
- Use quality soil as it is a direct correlation to the health of your plants. You can mix your own soil or use raised bed soil from your local Farm Supply.

My tips for a healthy garden include:

- **Measuring Moisture:** Not sure if your plants have enough water? Stick your pointer finger a few inches into the soil; if it feels dry, it's time to water.
- Pest & Weed Control: Use landscape fabric to help prevent weeds and gopher wire to keep critters from digging through the bottom of your raised beds.
- Fertilizing: When replanting, incorporate a small handful of compost into the hole and mix with soil before placing the plant.

Now that you have all your supplies, it's all about location. Select a sunny location for your garden, providing at least 6 to 8 hours of direct sunlight daily. Once your raised bed is established, it's time to fill it with your favorite veggies and herbs.



- Choosing Vegetables: Stop by any of our locations with nurseries and select from our wide range of starters or seeds from our selected growers.
 Consider starting with some easier veggies like lettuce, tomatoes, peppers carrots, or peas.
- Keep going with a fertilizer program. Plants, like people, need good nutrition to fight off diseases and to be strong and productive.
- Look for the appropriate treatment to keep pests at bay. Neem oil, bacillus thuringiensis and fungicides are good to have on hand.
- Weeds starting to show? Hula hoe is a gardener's friend for small beds.
- Time to harvest? Having gloves, clippers, and a harvest basket ready to fill are a must!



KNOW YOUR ZONE

Knowing your plant zone is essential for successful gardening, as it helps you choose plants that are well-suited for your climate. To determine your zone, check out the Plant Hardiness Zone Map developed by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) at https://planthardiness.ars.usda.gov.
